Although this trip was focused on nightbirds, we managed to see an assortment of other cool things along the way. Our short tour was focused on just three locations with nights in Tucson and Portal. Of course, the nightbirds took center stage, from our first encounter with Elf Owl up on Mt. Lemmon to the handsome Burrowing Owl we saw just before settling in to our Tucson motel on the final evening. We managed a respectable eight species of owls plus four nightjars (two heard) as well.

<u>Cuculidae (Cuckoos)</u> GREATER ROADRUNNER (Geococcyx californianus)

Strigidae (Owls)

FLAMMULATED OWL (Psiloscops flammeolus) – Well heard and seen in flight in the Catalinas.
WESTERN SCREECH-OWL (Megascops kennicottii) – Good views in Portal.
WHISKERED SCREECH-OWL (Megascops trichopsis) – We connected with this species near Portal after a couple of near misses in the Catalinas.
GREAT HORNED OWL (Bubo virginianus) – A few good looks on this trip.
NORTHERN PYGMY-OWL (Glaucidium gnoma) – Terrific views of one in lower Miller Canyon.
ELF OWL (Micrathene whitneyi) – First seen in the Catalinas and again in Portal.
BURROWING OWL (Athene cunicularia) – Last bird of the trip was this handsome find near our hotel.
SPOTTED OWL (Strix occidentalis) – We saw the female peering out from her nest cavity in Miller Canyon.
Caprimulgidae (Nightjars and Allies)
LESSER NIGHTHAWK (Chordeiles acutipennis) – Night looks on our way down from Mt. Lemmon and then again on the final evening.

COMMON POORWILL (Phalaenoptilus nuttallii) – We could not get this one to show well for us. [*] BUFF-COLLARED NIGHTJAR (Antrostomus ridgwayi) – Good audio of the stakeout bird along Proctor Road. [*] MEXICAN WHIP-POOR-WILL (Antrostomus arizonae arizonae) – Great views of one on the first evening and again the following night near Portal.

<u>Apodidae (Swifts)</u> WHITE-THROATED SWIFT (Aeronautes saxatalis)

<u>Trochilidae (Hummingbirds)</u> MAGNIFICENT HUMMINGBIRD (Eugenes fulgens) BLUE-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD (Lampornis clemenciae) BLACK-CHINNED HUMMINGBIRD (Archilochus alexandri) ANNA'S HUMMINGBIRD (Calypte anna) BROAD-TAILED HUMMINGBIRD (Selasphorus platycercus) BROAD-BILLED HUMMINGBIRD (Cynanthus latirostris) WHITE-EARED HUMMINGBIRD (Hylocharis leucotis) – Good views of a male and female at Beatty's feeders in Miller Canyon. *Trogonidae (Trogons)* ELEGANT TROGON (Trogon elegans) – A beautiful male seen along Cave Creek. *Picidae (Woodpeckers)* ACORN WOODPECKER (Melanerpes formicivorus)

LADDER-BACKED WOODPECKER (Picoides scalaris) HAIRY WOODPECKER (Picoides villosus) ARIZONA WOODPECKER (Picoides arizonae) NORTHERN FLICKER (RED-SHAFTED) (Colaptes auratus cafer)

Tyrannidae (Tyrant Flycatchers) GREATER PEWEE (Contopus pertinax) – A singing bird seen near East Turkey Creek. WESTERN WOOD-PEWEE (Contopus sordidulus) HAMMOND'S FLYCATCHER (Empidonax hammondii) DUSKY FLYCATCHER (Empidonax oberholseri) PACIFIC-SLOPE FLYCATCHER (Empidonax difficilis) CORDILLERAN FLYCATCHER (Empidonax occidentalis) BUFF-BREASTED FLYCATCHER (Empidonax fulvifrons) – After a bit of searching, we eventually connected with a couple of these. SAY'S PHOEBE (Sayornis saya) VERMILION FLYCATCHER (Pyrocephalus rubinus) DUSKY-CAPPED FLYCATCHER (Myiarchus tuberculifer) ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHER (Myiarchus cinerascens) BROWN-CRESTED FLYCATCHER (Myiarchus tyrannulus) CASSIN'S KINGBIRD (Tyrannus vociferans) WESTERN KINGBIRD (Tyrannus verticalis)

Laniidae (Shrikes) LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE (Lanius ludovicianus)

<u>Vireonidae (Vireos)</u> BELL'S VIREO (Vireo bellii) PLUMBEOUS VIREO (Vireo plumbeus) HUTTON'S VIREO (Vireo huttoni) WARBLING VIREO (Vireo gilvus)

Corvidae (Crows, Jays, and Magpies) STELLER'S JAY (Cyanocitta stelleri) WESTERN SCRUB-JAY (WOODHOUSE'S) (Aphelocoma californica woodhouseii) – One came in right to Portal. MEXICAN JAY (Aphelocoma wollweberi) CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN (Corvus cryptoleucus) COMMON RAVEN (Corvus corax)

<u>Alaudidae (Larks)</u> HORNED LARK (Eremophila alpestris)

<u>Hirundinidae (Swallows)</u> VIOLET-GREEN SWALLOW (Tachycineta thalassina) BARN SWALLOW (Hirundo rustica) CLIFF SWALLOW (Petrochelidon pyrrhonota)

<u>Paridae (Chickadees and Tits)</u> MEXICAN CHICKADEE (Poecile sclateri) – Good looks at a few of these in the high country of the Chiricahuas. BRIDLED TITMOUSE (Baeolophus wollweberi)

<u>Remizidae (Penduline-Tits)</u> VERDIN (Auriparus flaviceps) [*]

<u>Aegithalidae (Long-tailed Tits)</u> **BUSHTIT** (Psaltriparus minimus)

<u>Sittidae (Nuthatches)</u> RED-BREASTED NUTHATCH (Sitta canadensis) WHITE-BREASTED NUTHATCH (INTERIOR WEST) (Sitta carolinensis nelsoni) – The identification of this species complex was featured in a recent issue of Birding Magazine 46(3):26-32. Potentially more than one species involved. Stay tuned.

Quite a rarity in the ABA area with but four records.

<u>Turdidae (Thrushes and Allies)</u> EASTERN BLUEBIRD (MEXICAN) (Sialia sialis fulva) WESTERN BLUEBIRD (Sialia mexicana) TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE (Myadestes townsendi) HERMIT THRUSH (Catharus guttatus) AMERICAN ROBIN (Turdus migratorius)

Mimidae (Mockingbirds and Thrashers) CURVE-BILLED THRASHER (Toxostoma curvirostre) BENDIRE'S THRASHER (Toxostoma bendirei) – Several good looks at this species around Rodeo. CRISSAL THRASHER (Toxostoma crissale) – We were really lucky to encounter a pair of these in Rodeo. A touch species to see well. NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD (Mimus polyglottos)

<u>Peucedramidae (Olive Warbler)</u> OLIVE WARBLER (Peucedramus taeniatus) – Several great views on the trip beginning with those on Mt. Lemmon.

WHITE-THROATED SPARROW (Zonotrichia albicollis) – A local rarity seen at Bob Rodriguez's feeders. WHITE-CROWNED SPARROW (MOUNTAIN) (Zonotrichia leucophrys oriantha) YELLOW-EYED JUNCO (Junco phaeonotus)

Cardinalidae (Cardinals and Allies) HEPATIC TANAGER (Piranga flava) SUMMER TANAGER (Piranga rubra) WESTERN TANAGER (Piranga ludoviciana) – Wow, these were everywhere this trip. Great looks at several feeding in mulberries right in Rodeo. NORTHERN CARDINAL (Cardinalis cardinalis) PYRRHULOXIA (Cardinalis sinuatus) BLACK-HEADED GROSBEAK (Pheucticus melanocephalus) BLUE GROSBEAK (Passerina caerulea) LAZULI BUNTING (Passerina amoena)

Icteridae (Troupials and Allies) YELLOW-HEADED BLACKBIRD (Xanthocephalus xanthocephalus) – A couple of these at Willcox. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Totals for the tour: 160 bird taxa and 11 mammal taxa
