**Cloudforests of Ecuador: All the Best of the Wild Northwest 2017**

This was my first Cloudforests of Ecuador trip, and the reason I wanted to do this trip is because the Cloudforest is a unique place with a lot of unique birds. The tour is mostly focused at an elevation of 4000 to 5000 feet, which is true cloudforest. We had only one day above (Yanacocha, traveling from Quito) and one day below (Silanche, which is in the lowlands) the actual cloudforest elevations.

We stayed in two lodges on the western side of the Pichincha province, which were the perfect locations to look for many of the species we wanted to see. The simplicity of Maquipucuna was superb, and we felt the wildness and beauty of the place when we arrived. Owl Butterflies were in the open dining room, and from our dinner-table we could see Oilbirds eating palm fruits. What a great meal experience, right? The river had White-capped Dippers, Torrent Tyrannulets, Green-fronted Lancebill and Torrent Ducks just 10 meters away from the dining room. The many trails in the reserve provided us the opportunity to explore, and we managed to see Golden-headed Quetzal, Scarlet-rumped Cacique, and many tanagers. Deeper in the forest, we found the more secretive birds, like the very special White-faced Nunbird, Barred and White-whiskered Puffbirds, and even Lanceolated Monklet.

On our way to Sachatamia, we added some other great Choco endemic birds like Plate-billed Mountain-Toucan, Gorgeted Sunangel, and Empress Brilliant. Sachatamia, a lodge with a lot of charm and comfort, was a great place to discover nearby areas. The visit to the Umbrellabird lek was superb, and a few males were showing off. Mashpi Road and Amagusa Reserve worked out great for the birds that we needed. Moss-backed and Glistening-green Tanagers were around, and we found a Lyre-tailed Nightjar with a baby at the entrance to Mashpi Lodge.

Silanche was full of action and colors; Rufous-winged, Golden-hooded and Blue-whiskered Tanagers were seen. Mashpishungo was a great place to see the Rufous-crowned Antpitta plus many other stunning birds, and we also got to see the chocolate project that Alejandro and Agustina have in the area. (The chocolate was delicious!)

To finish our Cloudforest adventure, we visited Angel Paz. The Andean Cock-of-the-rock lek was active and they were on full display, three Antpittas were around, followed by a Toucan Barbet (thank god!)..... a last-minute bird for us!

And all this happened because there was a very intrepid, lovely group of people who joined me to do this truly amazing adventure. For that reason, I would like to thank all of you for coming to visit Ecuador. The last thank you is to Edgar, our nice driver and good spotter, ha.....!

**SHARP-SHINNED HAWK (PLAIN-BREASTED)** (*Accipiter striatus ventralis*) – A bird with prey in his talons was seen at Bellavista.

*Caprimulgidae (Nightjars and Allies)*

**LYRE-TAILED NIGHTJAR** (*Uropsalis lyra lyra*) – A female with a chick were at the entrance of Mashpi Lodge.

*Steatornithidae (Oilbird)*

**OILBIRD** (*Steatornis caripensis*) – Two birds were feeding off palm fruits the first night at Maquipucuna.

*Apodidae (Swifts)*

**WHITE-COLLARED SWIFT** (*Streptoprocne zonaris*)

**GRAY-RUMPED SWIFT (OCCIDENTALIS)** (*Chaetura cinereiventris occidentalis*)

**LESSER SWALLOW-TAILED SWIFT** (*Panyptila cayennensis cayennensis*) – Fantastic views of this very distinctive swift from the tower in Silanche.

*Trochilidae (Hummingbirds)*

**WHITE-NECKED JACOBIN** (*Florisuga mellivora*)

**WHITE-WHISKERED HERMIT** (*Phaethornis yaruqui*) – A dark hermit that is very common at Maquipucuna.

**TAWNY-BELLIED HERMIT** (*Phaethornis syrmatophorus*)

**STRIPE-THROATED HERMIT** (*Phaethornis strigularis*)

**GREEN-FRONTED LANCEBILL** (*Doryfera ludovicae ludovicae*) – The river at Maquipucuna was the hunting spot for this unique hummingbird.

**WEDGE-BILLED HUMMINGBIRD** (*Schistes geoffroyi albogularis*)

**BROWN VIOLETEAR** (*Colibri delphinae*)

**LESSER VIOLETEAR (ANDEAN)** (*Colibri cyanotus cyanotus*)

**SPARKLING VIOLETEAR** (*Colibri coruscans coruscans*)

**PURPLE-CROWNED FAIRY** (*Heliothryx barroti*) – The flight of this hummingbird is very distinctive, and we saw it a couple of times during our trip.

**GORGED SUNANGEL** (*Heliangelus strophianus*)

**GREEN THORNTAIL** (*Discosura conversii*)

**SPECKLED HUMMINGBIRD (MACULATA)** (*Adelomyia melanogenys maculata*)

**VIOLET-TAILED SYLPH** (*Aglaioecetes coelestis coelestis*) – There were a lot of special hummingbirds on our trip, but the males of this species were the best.

**PURPLE-BACKED THORNBILL** (*Ramphomicron microrhynchum microrhynchum*) – Some females were seen at Yanacocha.

**TYRIAN METALTAIL** (*Metallura tyrianthina*)

**SAPPHIRE-VENTED PUFFLEG (SAPPHIRE-VENTED)** (*Eriocnemis luciani luciani*)

**SHINING SUNBEAM** (*Aglaeactis cupripennis cupripennis*)

**BROWN INCA** (*Coeligena wilsoni*)

**COLLARED INCA** (*Coeligena torquata*)

**BUFF-WINGED STARFRONTEL** (*Coeligena lutetiae*)

**SWORD-BILLED HUMMINGBIRD** (*Ensifera ensifera*) – Always great to see this ridiculous bird; we saw a few at Yanacocha.

**GREAT SAPPHIREWING** (*Pterophanes cyanopterus cyanopterus*)

**BUFF-TAILED CORONET** (*Boissonneaua flavescens tinochlora*)

**VELVET-PURPLE CORONET** (*Boissonneaua jardini*) – These spectacular Choco endemics are very common at Sachatamia.

**PURPLE-BIBBED WHITETIP** (*Urosticte benjamini*)

**FAWN-BREASTED BRILLIANT** (*Heliodoxa rubinoides*)

**EMPEROR BRILLIANT** (*Heliodoxa imperatrix*) – The biggest of the Brilliants were seen a few times along the way.

**WESTERN EMERALD** (*Chlorostilbon melanorhynchus melanorhynchus*)

**CROWNED WOODNYMPH (NORTHERN GREEN-CROWNED)** (*Thalurania colombica verticeps*)

**COLLARED TROGON (COLLARED)** (*Trogon collaris virginalis*)

*Momotidae (Motmots)*

**RUFOUS MOTMOT** (*Baryphthengus martii semirufus*) – They were there every morning at the garden of Maquipucuna.

**BROAD-BILLED MOTMOT (BROAD-BILLED)** (*Electron platyrhynchum platyrhynchum*)

*Alcedinidae (Kingfishers)*

**RINGED KINGFISHER** (*Megaceryle torquata*)

**GREEN KINGFISHER** (*Chloroceryle americana*)

*Bucconidae (Puffbirds)*

**BARRED PUFFBIRD** (*Nystalus radiatus*)

**WHITE-WHISKERED PUFFBIRD** (*Malacoptila panamensis*)

**LANCEOLATED MONKLET** (*Micromonacha lanceolata*) – This is a widespread bird but is rarely seen; it was seen on our way to Santa Lucia.

**WHITE-FACED NUNBIRD** (*Hapaloptila castanea*) – Always difficult but we managed to see one on our way to Santa Lucia.

**RUFOUS-TAILED JACAMAR (BLACK-CHINNED)** (*Galbula ruficauda melanogenia*)

*Capitonidae (New World Barbets)*

**ORANGE-FRONTED BARBET** (*Capito squamatus*) – Quick views by some people at Silanche.

**RED-HEADED BARBET** (*Eubucco bourcierii aequatorialis*)

*Semnornithidae (Toucan-Barbets)*

**TOUCAN BARBET** (*Semnornis ramphastinus ramphastinus*) – They were around, and we managed to see them the last day at Angel's place.

*Ramphastidae (Toucans)*

**CRIMSON-RUMPED TOUCANET** (*Aulacorhynchus haematopygus sexnotatus*)

**PLATE-BILLED MOUNTAIN-TOUCAN** (*Andigena laminirostris*) – Edgar our driver found one building a nest in the upper Tandayapa valley.

**COLLARED ARACARI (PALE-MANDIBLED)** (*Pteroglossus torquatus erythropygius*)

**YELLOW-THROATED TOUCAN (CHESTNUT-MANDIBLED)** (*Ramphastos ambiguus swainsonii*)

**CHOCO TOUCAN** (*Ramphastos brevis*) – This is the one with a very dark lower mandible, seen several times.

*Picidae (Woodpeckers)*

**BLACK-CHEEKED WOODPECKER** (*Melanerpes pucherani*)

**SMOKY-BROWN WOODPECKER** (*Picoides fumigatus fumigatus*)

**RED-RUMPED WOODPECKER** (*Veniliornis kirkii*)

**SCARLET-BACKED WOODPECKER** (*Veniliornis callonotus*) – There was a nice pair at Mashpishungo.

**YELLOW-VENTED WOODPECKER** (*Veniliornis dignus*) [\*]

**CARUNCULATED CARACARA** (*Phalcoboenus carunculatus*) – We were pleasantly surprised to see a pair on the grassland below Nono. Normally they are paramo birds.

**LAUGHING FALCON** (*Herpetotheres cachinnans*)

**AMERICAN KESTREL (SOUTH AMERICAN)** (*Falco sparverius aequatorialis*)

**BAT FALCON** (*Falco rufigularis*) – A single bird was seen at Maquipucuna.

*Psittacidae (New World and African Parrots)*

**ROSE-FACED PARROT** (*Pyrilia pulchra*)

**RED-BILLED PARROT** (*Pionus sordidus corallinus*)

**BLUE-HEADED PARROT** (*Pionus menstruus*)

**BRONZE-WINGED PARROT** (*Pionus chalcopterus*) – The most common parrot in the lowlands.

**MAROON-TAILED PARAKEET (CHOCO)** (*Pyrrhura melanura pacifica*)

*Thamnophilidae (Typical Antbirds)*

**RUFOUS-RUMPED ANTWREN** (*Euchrepomis callinota callinota*)

**BLACK-CROWNED ANTSHRIKE** (*Thamnophilus atrinucha*)

**UNIFORM ANTSHRIKE** (*Thamnophilus unicolor unicolor*) – This bird was seen on our way up to Santa Lucia.

**RUSSET ANTSHRIKE (TAWNY)** (*Thamnistes anabatinus intermedius*)

**PLAIN ANTVIREO** (*Dysithamnus mentalis aequatorialis*) – A pair was seen at Maquipucuna.

**CHECKER-THROATED ANTWREN** (*Epinecrophylla fulviventris*)

**PACIFIC ANTWREN** (*Myrmotherula pacifica*) – Nice looks of this stripy antwren that likes open places. Mashpishungo's garden was a perfect place for them.

**WHITE-FLANKED ANTWREN (WHITE-FLANKED)** (*Myrmotherula axillaris albigena*)

**SLATY ANTWREN** (*Myrmotherula schisticolor schisticolor*)

**DOT-WINGED ANTWREN** (*Microrhopias quixensis consobrina*) – Fantastic looks at this colorful antwren that travels in groups. For this species, Silanche was the place!

**WHITE-BACKED FIRE-EYE (PACIFIC)** (*Pyriglena leuconota pacifica*) [\*]

**CHESTNUT-BACKED ANTBIIRD** (*Poliocrania exsul maculifer*)

**ESMERALDAS ANTBIIRD** (*Sipia nigricauda*) – Seen nicely on the main trail in Maquipucuna.

**ZELEDON'S ANTBIIRD (CHOCO)** (*Hafferia zeledoni berlepschi*)

**BICOLORED ANTBIIRD** (*Gymnopithys bicolor aequatorialis*) [\*]

### Conopophagidae (Gnateaters)

**RUFOUS-CROWNED ANTPITTA** (*Pittasoma rufopileatum rufopileatum*) – We had to do a trip to Mashpihongo for this rare bird; it worked it out nicely when after waiting a while, Danilo, our local guide, found the bird that came to eat grasshoppers.

### Grallariidae (Antpittas)

**MOUSTACHED ANTPITTA** (*Grallaria aleni andaquiensis*) – This was number three of the Antpittas that we saw at Angel's place.

**CHESTNUT-CROWNED ANTPITTA** (*Grallaria ruficapilla ruficapilla*)

**CHESTNUT-NAPED ANTPITTA** (*Grallaria nuchalis*) – This bird was heard only at Yanacocha. [\*]
